Other than free Web site hosting and support for small chapters, what other funds are budgeted to spend at the component level?	PMI's commitment to volunteer leadership has been a primary focus and objective over the past two years. As such, PMI has allocated resources to increase the number of PMI Leadership Meetings from two per year in North America, to four annual meetings with one each in North America, Latin America, EMEA (Europe, Middle East and Africa), and Asia Pacific. Also, in 2003 PMI assumed full responsibility for the Component Mentor Program, adding fourteen volunteer leaders to our cadre of leaders assisting with mentoring, coaching and operational excellence for our components. As the Leadership Development matures within our organization, we continue to evaluate alternative means to provide support at the local and regional level.
What percentage of \$115 dues goes toward component support?	Each year PMI produces the PMI Annual Report and sends this report to each member of the Institute. How will the Leadership Development Program benefit the volunteer leader and propel them beyond being a PM into the executive level in their careers (Not a PMI career)?	PMI's Volunteer Leadership Development Program incorporates individual leadership development and training, with curriculum that focuses on the people skills such as communication, strategic thinking skills, coaching and mentoring. Research conducted over the past two years in project management and other professional associations, has shown that these elements are deemed important, if not necessary, in professional development and advancement in C-Suite positions. As we roll out the PM Career Path initiative, the interpersonal leadership development that is available through the PMI Volunteer leadership program will mirror that in the career path framework. Can we change the charter renewal to a deadline date after tax deadline?	The Charter Renewal deadline is 1 February of each calendar year. However, any component that needs or desires to have an extension date for filing their charter renewal can request this by contacting Anne Jenneman, Component Relations Coordinator at <a href="mailto:Anne.jenneman@pmi.org">Anne.jenneman@pmi.org</a> .
How come some PMI Chapters are 501(c)6 and some are 501(c)3?	The correct not-for-profit tax status for a chartered PMI Component is as a 501(c)6 membership association. In the early years of component development, some components incorporated as 501(c)3 organizations. The current not-for-profit tax laws do not allow for a 501(c)3 to change to a 501(c)6 without dissolving the original organization and distributing assets to another 501(c)3 organization. Assets cannot be distributed to a 501(c)6 organization. PMI has been working with the handful of chapters that are incorporated as 501(c)3's, but at this time, do not have a definitive remedy for changing their tax status.
How can we help GOC help us?	With the work completed to date on PMI's strategic plan, and a clear vision for the future of PMI, the role of PMI's component

	community becomes even more important in helping to drive and support the strategic objectives of the Institute. As our component leaders engage in strategic planning, the alignment of component operations in support of advocacy and partnership will be key.
What is GOC doing to recycle or use past component leaders?	PMI's Volunteer Leadership Development Program will not only capture and engage new volunteers; it will also provide a career path for existing and senior volunteer leaders. The Volunteer Leadership program will provide opportunities for Level 3 and 4 volunteers to engage in coaching, mentoring, as well as teaching and leading presentations and workshops in various leadership settings.
